Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, greetings from Cameroon. We pray the Lord has been blessing you in many ways. By his grace we are doing great.

This report contains Camwork activities for the months of July, August and September: mainly YEP/VBS, the Blands' visit, the Kerusso experience, The daycare project, the work in Bonaberi and Bomono congregations and about the Bassay family.

The Youth's Engagement Program / Vacation Bible School (YEP/VBS) began on June 14 and ended on August 23. It was held in nine different locations, and we had about 821 children. The theme of this year was Walking with Jesus. We had a great time with the kids learning and practicing how to walk with Jesus. We pray that these lessons will sink into their fragile hearts and help them walk through this perverse world successfully. There will be a separate report on this. In all the closing ceremonies the parents were very happy and appreciated the work. We pray that those who are not yet Christians will let their children attend our children Bible classes on Sundays and consider giving their lives to Christ.



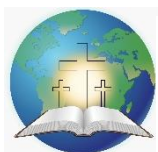

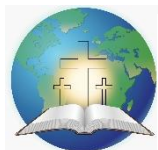

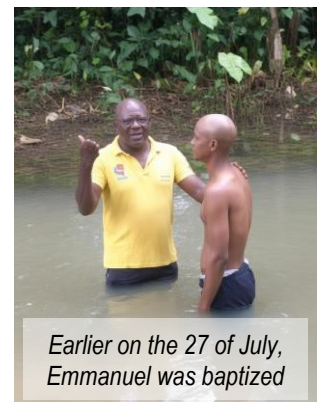

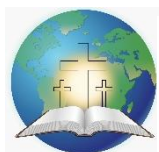

Meanwhile there has been work going on for **setting up the daycare**. It finally opened on Monday September 7. There are already two cute little girls, 4 and 6 months old and a one-year-old boy. It is a beautiful experience. We are happy to bring relief to working mothers who needed a safe place for their babies. Please pray that God will bring many more kids. There is a capacity of twenty for now.

Concerning **the Dreamt Center**, it has been concluded that it will begin with children's home and a medical center. Right now, we have funds for one children's home and a promise of half the amount of another one, looking for a match. One home will contain a living room, four bedrooms, three toilets and a kitchen. It costs approximately \$27,000 U.S dollars.

Meanwhile **Louis and Linda are still working in Bonaberi and Bomono**. The Bonaberi preacher (Tembeng Christian) and his family are going through a very difficult time. The wife (Otilia) was diagnosed with breast cancer. Presently she is in India receiving treatment while her kids (18 months and 4 months old) and her husband are in Bonaberi. This family needs prayers and financial help since her treatment is very costly.

For Upcoming Events, the two major ones are the Soul Saving Mission at Ebonji Tombel in October from the 8th to the 11th and the prison visit on the 12th of December. We are also working on **Noble Age 6**; a curriculum designed for children coming of age.

About the Bassay family, Gabby, Alan, and their cousins Praise and Favour, and Mariam (our 'adopted' daughter) resumed school on September 7. This school year will be special and hectic because Alan will be taking his first national exam leading him to secondary school; while Gabby, Praise and Mariam will be taking their second national exam leading them to high school. Please pray for success. Renea will resume in October because she's in college. It will be her third year. We are grateful Lori-Angela found a place out of campus thanks to Sandy Rogers and for Chris Lowe who arranged transportation for her. Our prayer is that she will be successful in her studies.
